Rate of play: 36 moves in 80 minutes, followed by 10 minutes to finish the game, with an increment of 15 seconds per move from move 1.

All events are Swiss competitions, not knockouts. The venue, Whittlesford Memorial Hall, Mill Lane, Whittlesford, Cambridgeshire, CB22 4NE, has a car park, and there is on-street parking close by. It's about a mile from Whittlesford Parkway railway station. There are two hotels close to the station, and a number of pubs and B&Bs in and near the village, but limited other shopping outlets. Free tea coffee and biscuits will be available during the Congress.

ELIGIBILITY AND CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Only EACU players are eligible to play in any section of this congress. An EACU player is one who (i) currently lives in, or (ii) has for a consecutive 5 year period lived in, or (iii) is currently a student at a school, college or university in, or (iv) was born in, or (v) is currently a member of a club in or affiliated to, Bedfordshire, Cambridgeshire, Hertfordshire, Norfolk or Suffolk.

In all matters, the Chief Controller's decision shall be final.

It is a condition of entry that players agree to their grading information being published on the ECF Website.


The Organisers reserve the right to transfer players from one section to another or to refuse entry to any player without giving any reason, and to merge sections and/or to increase or reduce the prize fund and its distribution depending upon entries.

A junior is a player born on or after 1 September 2000.

Any player arriving more than 30 minutes later than the scheduled start time for any round will be defaulted that game, and their opponent re-paired if possible.

Mobile phones must be switched off in the playing area, and must not be on a player's person at any time during their game. Any player whose mobile phone makes any sound during play, or who is found to be using or consulting any device capable of suggesting chess moves, will be defaulted that game.

All entries postmarked on or before 2 March 2019, or received electronically on or before that date, will be entitled to a £3.00 Early Entry Discount. All ECF Bronze Members or non-ECF Members who are not juniors have to pay a £7.50 surcharge. This upgrades Bronze membership to Silver membership, and for non-members represents the ECF’s ‘pay to play’ fee. All juniors who are not ECF members have to pay a £5.00 surcharge, but are encouraged to take out Silver ECF membership for the same cost (or free for their first year).

A half-point bye may be claimed in one of rounds 1-4, if requested on the entry form.

Subject to entries, other prizes may be added, and will be announced prior to the start of the second round. No player may win more than one monetary prize. Ungraded players may not win a grading prize or become Under-170 or Under-130 champions, and any monetary prize won by an ungraded player in the Under-170 or Under-130 sections will be subject to a 50% deduction. Grades used will be those at January 2019.

The highest-placed junior in each section will be the EACU Junior Champion for that section.

In the event of ties, all monetary prizes will be shared equally, but the Championship Titles will be determined by sums of progressive scores, and if that is equal, average opponents’ grade, and if that is then equal the toss of a coin. Each Champion will receive a permanent trophy in addition to their monetary prize.

The EACU Open Champion will qualify for a place in the 2019 British Championship, to be held in Torquay from 27 July to 4 August 2019. They will enter the British Championship at their own expense.

Anyone wishing to take photographs at the event should agree this in advance with the Chief Organiser. Photographs taken at the event may be used for publicity purposes by the EACU. Personal information provided on the entry form will be used for the purposes of running and administering the Congress, and for notification of future EACU events. Some game scores may also be published on the EACU and other websites.
